Currently, I serve as the Superintendent of English Modern School, overseeing a network of five campuses across Qatar,



educating over 5,000 students and boasting an impressive annual graduation rate with students attending universities worldwide. These campuses include:

Additionally, I founded Vision International School in Wakea, offering an American curriculum with AP programs and accommodating 1200 students. My achievements extend beyond leading these schools. I'm incredibly proud of being recognized three times as Teacher of the Year during my teaching career. Furthermore, in 2020, I received the prestigious Richard J. Bradley Award from the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC), a testament to my dedication to educational excellence. On April 29, 2024, children's author Amy Ludwig VanDerwater visited the Anne Frank Project Global Learning Lab at Buffalo State University. During this special Global Book Hour session, Amy read several poems from her book Forest Has a Song. The event connected third graders from South Buffalo Charter School with their peers from The School of the Nations in Brasília. This wonderful connection was facilitated, in part, through a partnership between The School of the Nations and the International Graduate Programs for Educators office at SUNY Buffalo State University, utilizing the advanced technology graciously provided by the Anne Frank Project.

In addition to the read-aloud, Amy shared valuable insights into her writing process, offering the young students a glimpse into the world of poetry creation. The session concluded with a lively Q&A session where the children had the opportunity to ask Amy questions and share their own poetry, fostering a deeper appreciation for literature and creative expression across continents.

Additional News

Our director Brandon Kawa and Tamara Horstman-Riphahn, along with IPDS alum Bailey Buckley presented at the National Association of School-University Partnerships in Anaheim, California in March during a session entitled "Evaluating the Transformative Influence of a Teach-and-Study Away Program on Alumni: Cultivating Skillful, Empathetic and Broad-Minded Educators and Citizens Through a Globalized Exchange of Thoughts and Ideas" which presented research examining the transformative impact of SUNY Buffalo State University's School of Education's International Professional Development Schools (IPDS) consortium. The study assessed the lasting influence of this faculty-led teach and study away experience on participants, exploring personal, professional, and pedagogical changes. Using mixed methods, we analyzed pre- and post-travel reflections and evaluations, along with an alumni survey. Preliminary findings suggest alumni experience personal growth, increased cultural sensitivity, and enhanced teaching practices. This research highlights the value of international professional development in shaping educators' lives, fostering a global perspective, and better preparing them for diverse student populations.
