

Summer 2022 online, independent course enrollment will begin May 1, 2022. Students can complete courses independently, online through SUNY Buffalo State. The cost to complete a course online independently is \$900. \$600 of which is paid to the IGPE office at SUNY Buffalo State and the other \$300 paid directly to the professor of the course.

PROFESSOR SPOTLIGHT

A NOTE FROM JUDI HARRIS

Currently a lecturer at Buffalo State College in the school of education, special education, and childhood education department. I am passionate about teaching and have worked with IGPE schools in Colombia, Brazil, Mexico and QSI School with teachers in 29 countries such as China, Iran, Czech Republic, Dushanbe & Sarajevo.

As a special education teacher, in the city of Buffalo for over 40 years, grades K- 12 and higher education the examination of social justice for individuals with disabilities in an urban environment, is inherent in my practice. My relationships with teachers and administrators throughout the BPS over the years affords me the opportunity to work with the college PDS consortium. This is a rich opportunity for the college students. We work and learn together.

Teaching in the "Transforming Lives through Teaching Learning Community, at Buffalo State College I focus on four principles of social justice—equity, access, participation, and rights. These principles are evident in both every class I teach and the student's coursework. These "principles" align with the IGPE program. In the fall of 2021, our Learning Community partnered with a 4th grade class from Brazil's School of the Nations and read "How Alma Got Her Name" during the Global Read Aloud.

As a member of and professor to the Urban Teacher Academy, this college preparatory program, in partnership with the Buffalo Public Schools Career and Technical Education program, develops a diverse generation of future educators for the Buffalo Public Schools through the practice of culturally responsive teaching. As an IGPE instructor knowledge and expertise in CRT benefits the population we serve.



During my tenure with the BPS, I worked with the SETRC network, administered by VESID. As training specialists, we designed and delivered programs based on local needs and statewide goals. For an IGPE instructor this skillset supports one of richest opportunities in the program. The "recreation" of a semester long course to be delivered within a five-day period challenges my creativity. It requires crafting the course while considering each schools identity. Creating assignments that allow for student voice to meet the needs of a range of teachers from PreK-12, including clerical staff and teacher assistants using equitable teaching and learning frameworks. Amanda Gorman wrote "There is always light. If only we're brave enough to see it. If only we're brave enough to be it." My goal is to bring the light to every class, serve the students and remain humble by the gifts my profession has given me over 44 years.

A NOTE FROM LILIT KHIAT

I grew up as an ambitious child in a close-knit Armenian family in Aleppo, Syria, this led me to travel, learn languages, and complete my undergraduate degree in my twenties. Unfortunately, the conflict in Syria derailed my plans to become an international teacher. I left home for a short holiday, but I did not know that I would never be able to return. Although I never forgot my dreams, I never expected them to become a reality considering the challenging circumstances. Years after not giving up and working hard on pursuing my plans, I did not only gain my International Teaching Certificate, but I enrolled at SUNY Buffalo New York State College's IGPE program and obtained my Masters in Multidisciplinary Studies in 2019.

I studied under a diverse team of highly educated instructors and worked with a wide variety of fellow students in the IGPE Program. I enjoyed interacting with my cohort. My students worked on Project Based Learning units, inquiry lessons, and technology based lessons. My action research in using metacognitive strategies to improve the reading fluency and comprehension of the students was a great success in class.



Today I continue to utilize the ideas I learned during my studies in the IGPE Program in my classroom. I have my own classroom as a full time teacher at an international school. I share ideas with my co-workers and have offered professional development to my colleagues. Due to the success I saw with my action research, I am further studying metacognition. My participation in the IGPE Program has given me the background to step into new ideas and pursuits. The IGPE Program showed me the path that I know will lead me deeper into my passions and career. I am committed to being a life-long learner and I am grateful for all of the people who made a difference to me by supporting me to earn my degree.
